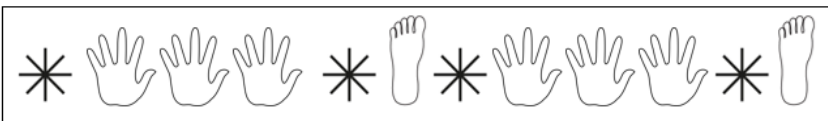
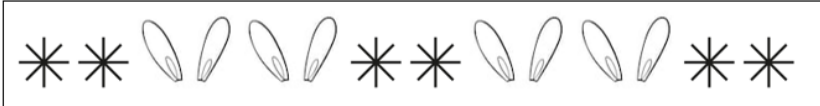

Maths

Today we would like you to get some exercise whilst also making patterns! Think of 2 or 3 movements and draw them in a pattern. Some ideas could be to draw a star to represent a star jump, a hand to represent a clap, rabbit ears to represent a bunny hop or a foot to represent a hop. We are sure you will have some super ideas of your own!



Make an obstacle course in your garden or house, with the patterns laid out along the course to follow. Make your patterns as long and as tricky as you like, but remember you will have to follow them! Ask some of your family if they can have a go too! Have fun!
