



Maths

This week we will be thinking about halving and sharing. Let's begin by sharing 'equally' and thinking about what this means. Use a bowl of food items such as strawberries or sweets. Explain that you are going to share them into 2 equal groups so you will each have half. Put a handful onto each plate without counting – make sure one plate has more than the other. Is this fair? Can you show me how to share fairly? The video link below will help you.
