## Maths

Today we are going to continue thinking about our numbers to 20. To begin, why not count from 0-20 and then 20-0 with your adult at home. Then, using a piece of paper, practise writing the numbers 0-20 ensuring they are all formed correctly.

## Superhero missing number sheet

Today you are going to be working off the superhero missing number sheet. You can either print out the sheet which you will find in our resources section or write your answers onto a plain piece of paper.
You must work out what number is missing from each star to help the superheroes complete their counting. Are you up for the challenge?
(If your child finds this work too easy or too hard- why not create your own version at home? You can draw a series of square boxes and reveal more or less numbers depending on your child's ability.)

## Extra challenge (optional)

If you have a printer at home, you may want to try some of the connect the dots that have been placed into our resource section. If you do not have a printer at home, why not try and create your own dot to dot?

## Literacy

In the story 'The Magic Bed' Georgie gets a new bed that is magic and he travels to different places. Today we would like you to use your imagination to design your own magic bed. (There is a template in the resource section if needed.) Once you have designed your magic bed talk with a grown up about where it would take you and then put your ideas into sentences.

Remember to think carefully about the sounds in your writing and remember capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
