Today we are going to practise telling the time using a clock with hands.

Watch the video provided all about telling the time.

Make your own clock face using the sheet provided in the resources section or you could draw round a plate and cut out some pointers of your own or use a paper plate. If you do not have a split pin to join on your hands you could use some rolled up sellotape or a straw. You might like to decorate your clock too!



Use your clock to show your grown up the following times:

8 o'clock

3 o'clock

11 o'clock

6 o'clock

half past 4

half past 12

half past 7

Can you make any other times?

Literacy - Phonics

Today we will be thinking about how many claps (or syllables) words have. Short words will only have one clap, longer words may have three, four, or even more claps!

Practise reading and clapping the following words -

sunset, farm, tooth, picnic, lockdown, crash, letterbox, sheep, seventeen.

Now write the words below on pieces of paper and sort them into sets:

1 clap

2 claps

3 claps

bell, afternoon, moon, hamburger, carpet, chest, mailbox, kangaroo, laptop

Can you think of two more words to write and add to each list? You might like to use a book to help you.

Challenge – can you find and read a word with more than 3 claps? How many claps does it have?
